A BRIEF HISTORY ABOUT SANDIA

To all the newcomers and established Sandia followers, here below is a general timeline of Sandia's history on Earth.

1990

• **September**: Tlkm ("Teal-come"), from Zeta Reticuli 2, arrived on Earth to manage The Sandia Mountain Information Station, located within the Sandia Mountain to the east of Albuquerque, New Mexico.

2013

• **September**: First telepathic "ping" received by Su Walker. Not knowing who Tlkm was at that time, Su named the being "Sandia."

2015

- May: Su set up a Facebook page (Sandia the ET) as per Tlkm's request.
- June: Su suggested that Twitter would be a more efficient means of interacting with Earth humans. Tlkm agreed and the Twitter account Sandia the ET (@sandiawisdom) was created.

2017

- Summer: Sandia announced that Official First Contact was planned for Fall2021
- Fall: www.sandia.space was created (now defunct). This was subsequently replaced by the current website official first contact.com.
- **December**: "Telepathy 101 Manual" was published. This manual on how to develop telepathic skills. It was dictated to Su by T'ni, a P'nti staff member. It is available as a free download from officialfirstcontact.com. It has been translated to more than 10 major Earth languages.

2018

- January: Tlkm announced increased CE-5 (close encounter of the fifth kind), or in-person soft contact.
- August: "Inviting ET", written by Su Walker, Rev. Otter and the P'nti was published. This is a manual on how to host your own CE-5 event.

- ✓ The files, photos and links do not redirect you towards undesirable websites.





3. Is Sandia Artificial Intelligence (AI)?


We do not think so because:


- ✓ AI can send tweets 24/7. Sandia can't do that.






4. Is Sandia a troll?

- ✓ Sandia warns trolls to stop before blocking them.

Attempts to gain your personal information

Scammers use all kinds of sneaky approaches to steal your personal details. Once obtained, they can use your identity to commit fraudulent activities such as using your credit card or opening a bank account.



Buying or selling



Dating & romance

Scammers take advantage of people looking for romantic partners, often via dating websites, apps or social media by pretending to be prospective companions. They play on emotional triggers to get you to provide money, gifts or personal details.



Fake charities

Scammers impersonate genuine charities and ask for donations or contact you claiming to collect money after natural disasters or major events.



Investments




Unexpected winnings

Don't be lured by a surprise win. These scams try to trick you into giving money upfront or your personal information in order to receive a prize from a lottery or competition that you never entered.








6. Is Sandia a joke?

Some people believe that Sandia is a joke because of the general way in which ufology is regarded. However, Sandia is not a joke because:

- ✓ Sandia is on Twitter almost everyday.
- ✓ Sandia answers people's questions.






7. Is Sandia just Su Walker?

Su Walker is the first person to publicly talk about Sandia. This has given rise to the suspicion that she has made the whole thing up. This is wrong because:

- ✓ Sandia asked Su to help him open the Twitter account.
- ✓ Sandia answers questions on many different topics. Neither Su nor any human currently possess such knowledge.
- ✓ Sandia's answers always make sense.
- ✓ Sandia is known to answer a lot of questions very quickly, sometimes within 5 minutes (see March 17th, 2019 Twitter archive).
- ✓ Sandia asks curious questions that only Earth children could ask.
- ✓ Su slows down her natural speaking flow rate when she is in telepathic communication with Sandia.
- ✓ On September 1st, 2017, Su Walker and Rev. White Otter were at the Psychic and Spiritual Sasquatch Conference in Chewelah, Washington (USA). Chewelah is one hour behind Albuquerque's time zone.
- Su was filmed speaking at 1:30 PM, at the same time Sandia sent a tweet (2:30 PM Albuquerque time).
- ✓ After listening to Su and Rev. White Otter radio interviews, there is no indication that either of them is pretending to be an ET.



8. Is Sandia an account for selling merchandise?

With regard to normal business practice as it relates to advertising and selling, Sandia is not an account for selling merchandise because:

- For the first four years of the life of the account the selling of t-shirts and books was done in a totally amateur fashion.
- ✓ Twitter is not the best platform for selling goods. Amazon or eBay are much better.
- ✓ The volume and rate of growth of twitter followers is too low for a commercial enterprise (8,000 followers in 2019, average increase of 2,000 followers per year).
- ✓ Sandia has not taken out any TV advertisements or done any online advertising.

9. Is Sandia purely the imagination of one or more science fiction writers?

The supposed writer does not follow the basic rules of fiction writing because:

- ✓ The characters (P'nti staff) do not interact with one another.
- ✓ There is no storyline or timeline. It is not a mystery or fantasy, in that the topics discussed can be quite mundane and do not really involve any great imagination.
- ✓ Twitter is not the best place to tell stories because of the limited number of characters (280 maximum).
- ✓ The writer(s), if they do exist, have not supplied sufficient material to flesh out a full book.





After earning two degrees in English literature, she decided to stop writing about everyone else's stories and get back to writing her own. Now she teaches first-year college students about the zombie apocalypse, Aristotelian ethics, and Beowulf (not all at once). 1. Start with Questions.

Some authors like to start with characters; others like to create the world and then populate it. I say-the world is a character, and now we're just quibbling over which character we make first.

In practice, I do both in parallel; I might hear a character's voice in my head, or have an idea for a character concept, but then I have to start asking why. why is she angry? Why is he alone in the middle of winter in the mountains? Why are the legion troops running? Hey...why is that village on fire?

The answers to my whys build character and plot, but they also show me the scaffolding of the world I'm creating. Then I just have to go and fill in the gaps. (This is where a miracle might come in handy. Alas.)

2. Create Complexity ... Slowly.

With On the Bones of Gods I started small, geographically: in Enemy, the story takes place during cold, snowy winter, in a small border city on the edge of an empire, where I could lay out the various ethnic and economic stress-points in the dominant culture. Then, in the second book, Outlaw, I moved the characters and action into the capital city, and further developed the political and socioeconomic conflicts within the Republic that would complicate the larger problem the characters are trying to solve.

As my plot in Enemy unfolded, my world-build had to expand and deepen as well. The world is also a character, in the sense that it develops, it changes, it has reasons that it works like it does. In a series, that character-world needs to be solid enough, realized enough, to sustain multiple installments. You should think about things like (but not limited to) gender, race, religions, languages, foods, music, taboos, regional quirks, accents.... And you'll need to repeat the process for every other culture your characters run into.

The more of those things that you know about, the more real the world feels. Then look for the seams, where say, class, gender and race intersect. The seams of a world are like tectonic plates building up pressure until something breaks. That's where the conflict happens, And conflict is what drives plot and character when you write a science fiction novel.

This is important in any novel; it's even more important in a series. Characters can, and do, develop. Worlds can also change and develop, But the rules, whatever they may be, need to remain consistent. If you establish in the first chapter of the first book that X happens because Y, you shouldn't change that in book three just because you got a better idea. If change happens, make it part of a story. Make sure there's a reason. This is true for characters, as well.

4. Character is Everything.

No matter how cool the world-no matter how detailed-characters are why readers stay with a book (or keep coming back to a series). Characters need to be unique individuals, not merely representative stereotypes of their respective cultura/eithnicity/species, but also not so unique that they don't seem like they could have come from the world you've created. Sometimes an outsider POV character-like Bren, in C.J. Cherry'hs Foreigner series, the lone human among alien atevi-gives the readers a path to understanding the othermess of the world, while showcasing the effects that othermess has on a normal human being. Sometimes several POV characters-as with Richard Morgan's Land Fit for Herroes series-offer readers several ways into the world, with different, and sometimes conflicting, perspectives. The tension among the characters, and their efforts to negotiate their differences, helps drive and complicate the narrative.

5. Are We There Yet?

If you're planning a book series, you need some hint of how it all ends. Are you aiming at an open or closed series? Epic or episodic? Are you trying to change the world and the characters irrevocably by the end of your series, like Lord of the Rings? Or do you want smaller stories in which actions accrete to change the world and the characters over time, as happens in Richard Kadrev's Sandman Slim series?

6. One Book At A Time.

Regardless—and this is the may be the most important thing when you write a science fiction novel series—you're only writing (and your readers are only reading) one book at a time. If the series itself maps a whole storyline, then each installment, each new book, is a stop on the journey. At each stop, the characters get their arcs, they develop, and they achieve—or fail—in their goals. Each story needs to be able to stand on its own.

- ✓ The vocabulary used does not match the symptoms associated with people who have DID.

Dissociative Identity Disorder (Multiple Personality Disorder)

Dissociative identity disorder (previously known as multiple personality disorder) is thought to be a complex psychological condition that is likely caused by many factors, including severe trauma during early childhood (usually extreme, repetitive physical, sexual, or emotional abuse).

What Is Dissociative Identity Disorder?

Most of us have experienced mild dissociation, which is like daydreaming or getting lost in the moment while working on a project. However, dissociative identity disorder is a severe form of dissociation, a mental process which produces a lack of connection in a person's thoughts, memories, feelings, actions, or sense of identity. Dissociative identity disorder is thought to stem from a combination of factors that may include trauma experienced by the person with the disorder. The dissociative aspect is thought to be a coping mechanism -- the person literally dissociates himself from a situation or experience that's too violent, traumatic, or painful to assimilate with his conscious self.

Along with the dissociation and multiple or split personalities, people with dissociative disorders may experience a number of other psychiatric problems, including symptoms:

- Depression
- Mood swings
- Suicidal tendencies
- · Sleep disorders (insomnia, night terrors, and sleep walking)
- · Anxiety, panic attacks, and phobias (flashbacks, reactions to stimuli or "triggers")
- · Alcohol and drug abuse
- · Compulsions and rituals
- Psychotic-like symptoms (including auditory and visual hallucinations)
- · Eating disorders

We would not consider Sandia to be a cult because:

- ✓ Sandia does not have bad intentions.
- ✓ Sandia does not preach; he does not ask his followers to follow a dogma.
- ✓ Sandia's tweets sometimes mention religion or what might be termed spiritual matters, but not exclusively and usually only in response to the twitter follower's questions.
- ✓ Sandia asks his twitter followers to have their own beliefs and use their own discernment.
- ✓ Sandia does not talk about a prophet or a God.
- ✓ Sandia does not request money either publicly or privately to run a "cult".

How to Identify a Dangerous Cult

It starts innocently. Maybe the new guy at work asks you to play bass in his indic rock band. A friend-of-a-friend invites you to a free vegan brunch. Your mother-in-law wants to share a life-changing home business opportunity with you. Accept the wrong offer, though, and you could find yourself dead-eyed, be-robed, and dancing around a burning pentagram to usher in the Seventh Age of Blood Antonement.

No one wants that kind of life for you.

When people think of cults, they tend to picture bizarte religious sets and operalyptic scenarios—the Branch Davidians burning up in their compound in Texas, or the corpses on the ground at Jonestown—but cults needn't be religious, and are anything but exotic. If you want to get literal about it, any group of like—minded people cult be considered a cult.

"The Democratic and Republican parties are cults," explained cult expert Paul Morantz. "I'm in a cult where everyone wears the same color and we meet for rituals every Saturday. It's called the USC Alumni Association." Morantz is an expert in distinguishing between innocent book clubs and apocalyptic death cults. He's been battling fringe groups like Synanon and The People's Temple in court since the 1970s, and he says that while cults can be seductive, the dangerous ones can be identified and avoided if you know what to look for.

"If a guy went to a bible study group that's a front for a dangerous cult, and he's been educated about how you can be done in by the group," Morantz said, "I think he could be OK."

Look at Who's in Charge

Cults are formed around strong leaders, so take a serious look at the motives and personality of the person in charge. According to Morantz and other cult experts, control-freak cult leaders are nearly interchangeable.

- Narcissistic personality—Dangerous cult leaders usually hold grandiose notions of their place in the world.
- Ability to read others— "A guy like Charles Manson had the ability to spot
 who, at a party, that he thought he could control. It just seems to be in his
 personality," Morantz said. Cult leaders "have the ability to size you up,
 and realize your weaknesses and get to your buttons."
- Claims of special powers: If a leader claims he's smarter, holier, and more
 pure than everyone else, think twice about signing up.
- Charisma meets anger: Dangerous cult leaders can be extremely loving, charming and affectionate, but often turn angry and abusive with no warning. This mercurial presentation keeps members off balance.

Look for Signs of "Brainwashing"

While the details of thought reform methods vary from cult to cult, the broad strokes have been around forever. So if you notice your righteous new friends using any of the techniques below, you might want to sneak out of the compound and call your dad:

- Isolation: Separating group members from family and friends forces them
 to rely on fellow cultists for all emotional needs. This is why many cults
 are based around communal living. (And why cult members are so boring.)
- Peer Pressure: It's nearly impossible to overstate the power of social norms on behavior—the only reason you're wearing pants right now is because that's what they exper you to do—but when you manipulated peer pressure consciously, you can make people give away their life savings, marry a stranger, or listen to the horrible rock opera you wrote.
- Confession: Dangerous cults are notorious for making members confess to
 past sins, often publicly, then using those confessions against them. Some
 groups keep elaborate files of their members' pasts for blackmail.
- Control: Cults often tell members when to eat, whom to sleep with, and
 what to do every second of every day. This induces dependency, and leaves
 little free time to question what the hell you're doing handing out Bible
 tracts in Sausalito when you have a BFA in English.
- Sleep Deprivation: Simply keeping people from sleep or rest is amazingly effective at controlling their thoughts. As Chuck Dederich, the leader of

- the Synanon rehab cult, described it: "If you keep people awake long enough, you can make them believe anything."
- Language Control: To enforce isolation, many groups replace common
 words with special jargon, or create new words to describe complicated
 abstractions. This makes conversations with outsiders tedious: It's just
 exhausting to explain the 17th Expositional Commandment of The Gospel
 of Norbert to your sister.
- Threats of Expulsion: Totalitarian groups often use the threat of expulsion to keep members in line. Once you've successfully defined the outside world as evil or deadly, it's easy to maintain discipline by threatening to throw someone out.

Ask Questions (Cults Hate That)

Maybe the easiest hallmark of a dangerous authoritative group is visible through its absence: Skepticism. Dangerous cults rarely, if ever, allow members to raise questions about the group or the group's beliefs. So the easiest way to suss out a dangerous cult may be to ask probing questions and note how they're answered. Even if you're just asking yourself.

"Back in the 60s, I was getting a lot peer pressure to take acid," Morantz said.

"So I went to see Timothy Leary speak, expecting a scientific explanation of what LSD does... Instead it was a bunch of slogans and everyone screaming and clapping."

"I wanted to stick my hand up and say, 'Can you stop the propaganda and just tell us what LSD is or does?' but I knew that if I did that, the mob would have attacked me. So I quietly exited, thinking I'd just seen the most dangerous man alive."

I'll leave Morantz with the last word, his personal failsafe method for determining whether a group is dangerous cult: "Count how many Hollywood stars are there," Morantz said. "If you get past five, get the fuck out."

7 Unusual Experiments by the U.S. Military

From an Old West camel corps to nuke-carrying train cars, learn the stories behind seven armed forces programs that didn't go according to plan.

1. The U.S. Camel Corps

Horses were the Army's primary form of transport during the 19th century, but things might have been very of War Jefferson Davis imported a herd of several dozen camels from North Africa and Turkey. Davis believed the "ships of the desert" would flourish in the arid climate of America's newly acquired territories in the Southwest, and early tests and supply runs seemed to back him up. The camels could go days without water, carried heavy loads with ease and navigated harsh terrain better than mules and horses. One previously skeptical surveyor even dubbed them "noble and useful brutes" after they impressed during an expedition to the Arizona-California border. But while the camels' hardiness was never in doubt, the Civil War effectively ended their stint in the armed services. Army brass lost interest in the outfit during the march to war, and it was finally disbanded after the Confederacy—ironically, with Davis as its president—captured its base at Camp Verde, Texas. Most of the remaining camels were later auctioned off to circuses and private citizens.

2. Project Iceworm

In 1958, the U.S. Army launched one of the most audacious experiments of the Cold War. As part of a topsecret project dubbed "Ceworm," they drew up plans to hide hundreds of ballistic missiles under Greenland's
ice caps. Once operational and concealed beneath the Arctic snows, the sites would be poised for potential
nuclear strikes on the Soviet mainland. To test out their designs, the Army first built Camp Century, a
prototype ice base constructed under the guise of being a scientific research facility. This sprawling outpost
consisted of some two-dozen underground tunnels carved out of the ice sheet and reinforced with steel and
snow. It had living quarters for more than 200 people and boasted its own laboratories, hospital and
theater—all of it powered by a state-of-the-art portable nuclear reactor. Camp Century may have been a
technological marvel, but it was no match for Mother Nature. After only a few years, shifts in the ice caps
caused many of its tunnels to become warped and structurally unsound. Convinced Greenland was no place
for nuclear weapons, the Army reluctantly scrapped the project in 1966.



The history of psychology is filled with fascinating studies and classic psychology experiments that helped change the way we think about ourselves and human behavior. Sometimes the results of these experiments were so surprising that they challenged conventional wisdom about the human mind and actions. In other cases, these experiments were also quite controversial.

Some of the most famous examples include Milgram's obedience experiment and Zimbardo's prison experiment. Explore some of these classic psychology experiments to learn more about some of the best-known research in psychology history.

¹ Harlow's Rhesus Monkey Experiments

In a series of controversial experiments conducted in the 1960s, psychologist <u>Harry Harlow</u> demonstrated the powerful effects of love on normal development. By showing the devastating effects of deprivation on young rhesus monkeys, Harlow revealed the importance of love for healthy childhood development. His experiments were often unethical and shockingly cruel, yet they uncovered fundamental truths that have heavily influenced our understanding of child development.

In one famous version of the experiments, infant monkeys were separated from their mothers immediately after birth and placed in an environment where they had access to either a wire monkey "mother" or a version of the faux-mother covered in a soft-terry cloth. While the wire mother provided food, the cloth mother provided only softness and comfort. Harlow found that while the infant monkeys would go to the wire mother for food, they vastly preferred the company of the soft and comforting cloth mother. The study demonstrated that maternal bonds were about much more than simply providing nourishment and that comfort and security played a major role in the formation of attachments.

² Pavlov's Classical Conditioning Experiments



The concept of <u>classical conditioning</u> is studied by every entry-level psychology student, so it may be surprising to learn that the man who first noted this phenomenon was not a psychologist at all.

<u>Pavlov</u> was actually studying the digestive systems of dogs when he noticed that his subjects began to salivate whenever they saw his lab assistant. What he soon discovered through his experiments was that certain responses could be conditioned by associating a previously neutral stimulus with a stimulus that naturally and automatically triggers a response. Pavlov's experiments with dogs established classical conditioning.

³ The Asch Conformity Experiments

14. Is Sandia located in the USA?


